These also provide us with important information about how children are likely to fare in their summer formal assessments (Year 2 and Year 6 SATs, the Year 1 phonics check, and the Year 4 Multiplication Check are all in the summer term) we can then ensure that we place the most appropriate interventions where they are needed.

Children are invited to attend in non-uniform for this day remember your red nose and for children to bring a donation towards the cause. A good deal of the money this year is going to those in need in Ukraine, and so please do help out where you can!
