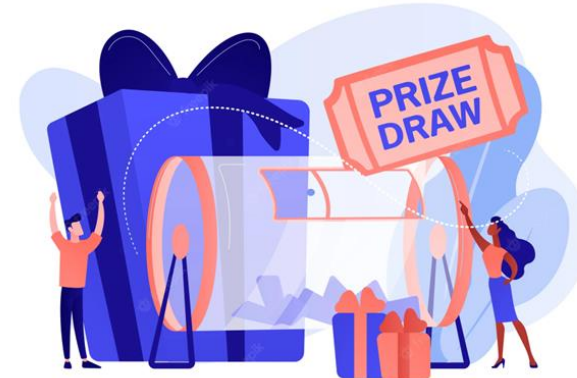

 - Goes out of their way to help someone else.



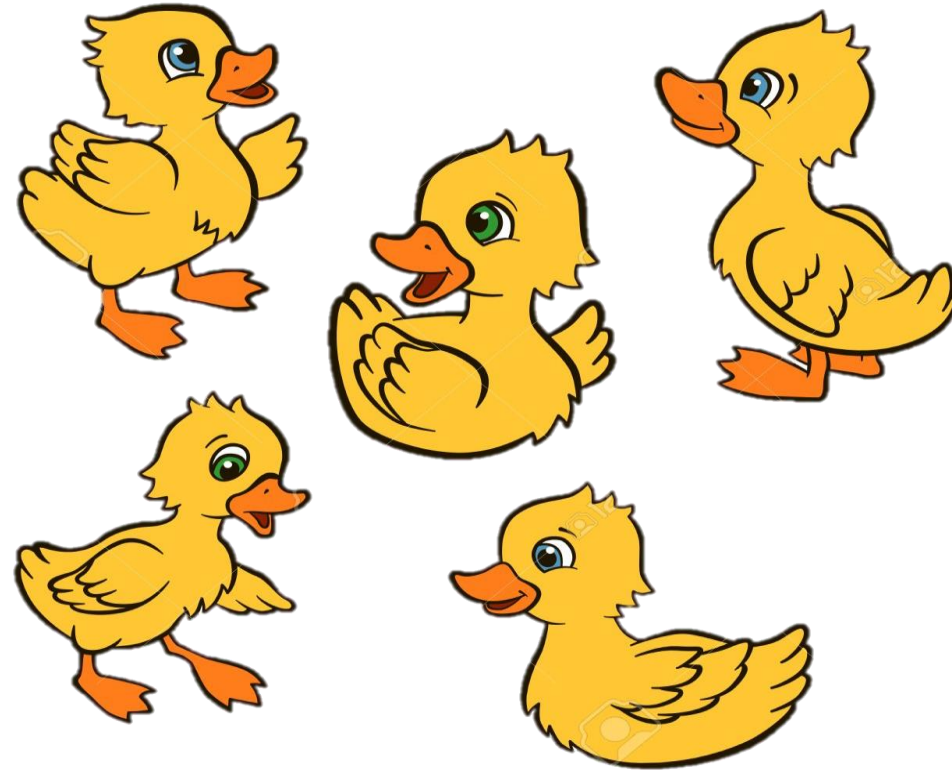

Name of the biome: Desert

African countries in this biome: Egypt, North Africa, Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Libya, Mauritania, Mali, Niger, Chad, Sudan

Climate: Hot, dry, rainfall

Animals: ostrich, eagle owls and sand yaks, most venomous scorpion.

Other facts: Only 200,000 km² of the Sahara are fertile, bases where dates & fruits are grown.

Name of the biome: Rainforest

African countries in this biome: Anglo, Central African Republic, Democratic Republic of Congo, Gabon & Guinea.

Climate: 22 degrees rainy

Animals: elephants, chimpanzees, gorillas, bonobos.

Other facts: There is a home to over 10,000 animals

Name of the biome: Savanna

African countries in this biome: Guinea, Sierra Leone, Liberia, Cote D'Ivoire, Ghana, Togo, Benin, Nigeria, Cameroon, Chad, Sudan, Zambia.

Climate: rainy dry

Animals: zebras, elephants, giraffes, gazelles, & buffalo, wildebeests.

Other facts: Many of the animals in the savanna have long legs which help them travel long distances.

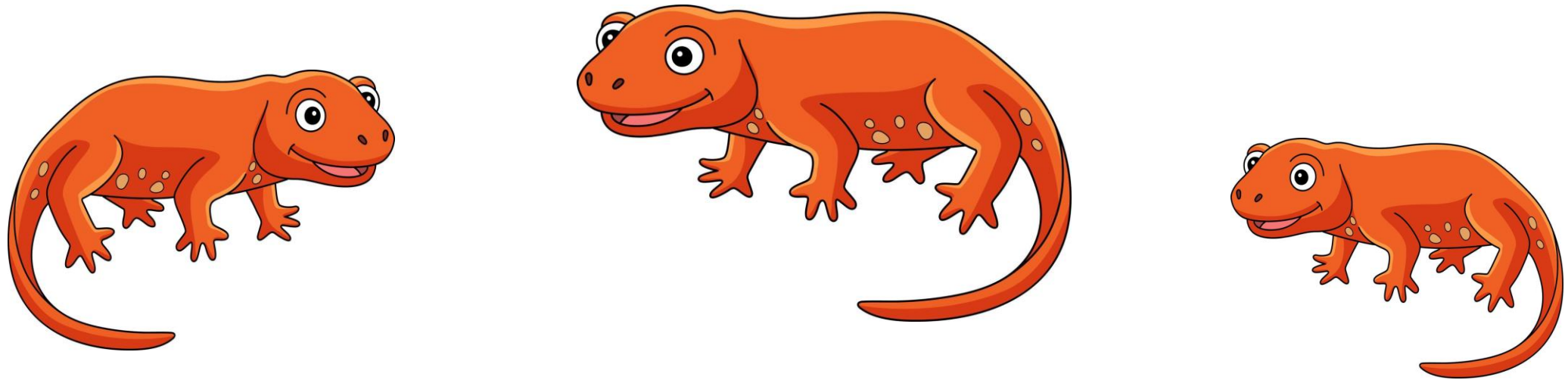

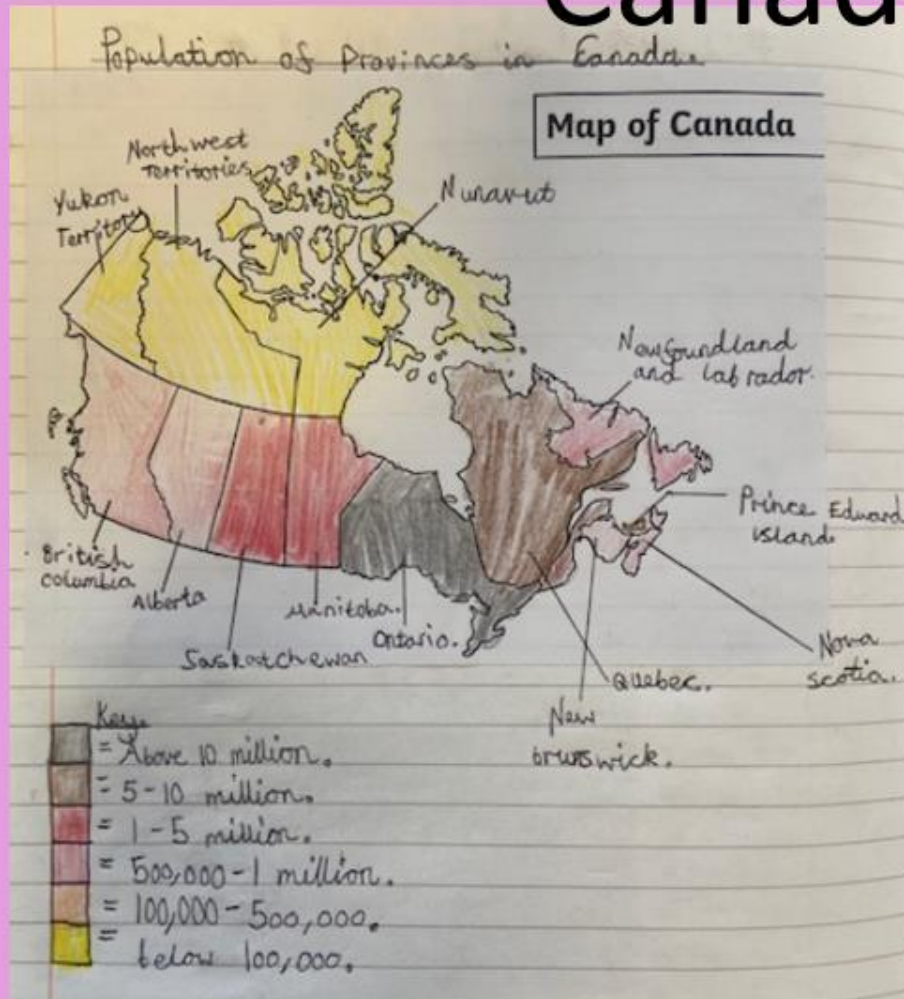

Canada's North is known for its rich minerals and metals such as copper, nickel, coal, uranium, tungsten and gold. It also makes diamonds.
British Columbia (West Coast)	It rains a lot on the coast but is dry in the interior. It's sort of a mix really.	It is a mild temperature and has some rocky mountains some forests. In winter the mountains are used for skiing and hiking.	Some of the animals that live here is killer whales, grizzly bears, moose, bighorn sheep, sea otters and mountain goats.	In the mountains you could find rich minerals and metals like gold, silver, copper, iron, lead, zinc, and molybdenum. It has lots of pine trees.
Alberta (Prairies) Nova Scotia (Atlantic Province)	It again is quite a mild temperature, and is in the East of Canada.	It has lots of grasslands, forests and Rocky plains which they used for skiing. Also for snowboarding.	You can find animals here like whales, puffins, seagulls, seals, moose and more.	This place is known for fishing and farming. Prince Edward Island is known for their potatoes.
