



Newts Newsletter – Autumn Term 2025

Dear Parents/carers,

Welcome back to the Autumn Term. I hope that you have all enjoyed a restful summer and are excited for the new school year. I am looking forward to seeing all the children and embarking on our learning journey together in Newts class!

This term our Topic will be **The Ancient Greeks** We will be immersing ourselves in what life was like during this time, looking at significant events and people, understanding important sources, and focusing on the similarities and differences between city states. Due to necessary shifts in the curriculum, some students may have covered the Ancient Greeks before, however we will be focusing on different areas as this time period is vast and full of exciting content! This will tie in nicely with the other subjects we are studying this term, such as coastal regions in Geography. We will be taking part in an Ancient Greek day run by an external provider- so please start thinking about costumes!

Swimming for year 4s will happen on Tuesday mornings (until February half-term) and PE will be on Tuesdays (for Year 5s) and Thursdays, so please ensure that children come in PE kit on that day. Every Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning, the class will be taught by Mrs Bailey.

Homework:

Homework grids will be sent home, which include a variety of tasks based on learning covered this half term. Children can either choose one task every couple of weeks or spend longer completing a bigger task over a series of weeks. There are no rules on how many tasks are to be completed but there will be rewards for those children who engage in them! The children will be given a homework book to complete the tasks, in which they bring in and share with the class. We will share, celebrate and give feedback to children on the last week each half term. Please bring in your homework on these dates.

Children will be given a homework planner to record their home reading and weekly homework tasks. **Each week the expectations are to:**

-Read at least 4 times a week

-Login to Times Tables Rockstars for at least 5 minutes twice a week

Children will also be given their spellings on a Monday and a small times table activity, if this is handed in completed, they are moved up the board.

It is important that children are reading every evening at home (for about 15 minutes) and should be logged in their reading record. This does not need to be reading to you every night and if your child is a confident reader you may sign to say they have read by themselves. The reading records will be checked every Friday, and we expect at least 4 adult signatures across the week. There is an incentive of an extra 10 minutes play time for this. Please include any relevant comments, if necessary, that we will read. Spellings will be completed throughout the week and will go home on Monday with the children to practice at home where possible, with weekly spelling tests on Friday.

I would like to emphasise how important it is for your child to be accessing TT Rockstars and practising as much as possible, as this is crucial for accessing Year 4 and 5 Maths content. Engaging with their studies at home massively impacts children's progress.

At the end of Year 4 the children will be completing the Multiplication Times Tables Check. More information can be found on:

Children should already have their logins but please see me if you are unable to access these.

Children will be given a homework planner to record their home reading and weekly homework tasks.

Each week the expectations are to:

-Read at least 4 times a week

-Login to Times Tables Rockstars for at least 5 minutes twice a week

As a parent/carer, we ask that you record the homework completed. In the homework diary, write down the reading that they have done on the right-hand side of the page and record which days they completed TT Rockstars on the left-hand side, along with your signature. We will check the diaries every Friday and if they have completed the above, they will get extra break time.

If you have any questions or concerns, I will be in the playground every day after school to help. Alternatively, please contact the office if you would like to arrange a meeting.
