Teachers will swap classes for a session to read you their favourite childhood books.

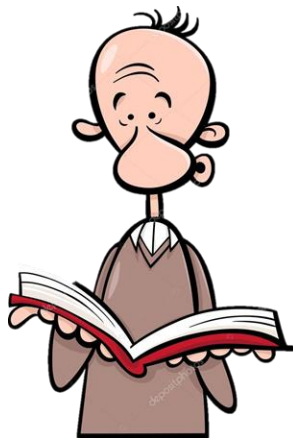
