

## Ancient Greek Homework Grid



<b>Science:</b> Research how igneous, sedimentary or metamorphic rocks are formed.	English (Creative Writing): Write a story set in Ancient Greece or about the Greek gods.	<b>History:</b> Draw or write a family tree of the Greek gods.	Art: Make a drawing or painting inspired by Ancient Greek art or architecture.
Art/DT: Draw or make a shield, amphora (vase) or helmet that may have been used in Ancient Greece.	History: Compare two city states in Ancient Greece. E.g Athens and Sparta. What was similar and what was different?	Maths: Make Ancient Greece themed Maths word problems. Try them out on a friend or family member and see if they get them right!	DT: Create a model of the Parthenon or of the Trojan Horse.
English: Read a fiction or non-fiction book related to Ancient Greece and write a book review about it. E.g. Percy Jackson, Greek Tales, Beasts of Olympus, Leo and the Gorgons Curse.	History/Art: Create a storyboard or comic of an Ancient Greek myth or story.	English/Drama Rewrite an Ancient Greek myth or story as a play or poem and perform it! DT: You could even make a mask to wear like they did in theatre performances!	PE: The Olympics committee have asked you to create a new Olympic sport. Explain the rules of this new sport. Include diagrams to help your explanation, or even photos of you partaking in this new sporting event!
<b>History:</b> Write a fact file about an Ancient Greek god, goddess or hero.	History/Maths: Make a timeline of at least five key events from Ancient Greece.	History/Geography: Draw or print and label a map with the major city states in Ancient Greece.	History/Maths: Using the Greek Alphabet, write a secret message! Remember to write a key.
History/Computing: Research and write facts or create a presentation about Pythagoras (mathematician), Archimedes (mathematician and inventor), Hippocrates (Doctor and Philosopher) or Aristotle (philosopher).	<b>History:</b> Make a quiz to test your friends about the Ancient Greeks!	English: Are all Greek monsters evil? Write a story or diary entry from the perspective of a Greek monster. E.g The Minotaur who is trapped in a maze with no one to speak to, or Medusa, who is cursed so everyone she looks at turns to stone.	Free Choice: Choose your own project related to Ancient Greece or another topic we've studied this half-term.  Surprise me with your creativity!
