World Book Day: On Thursday 7th March, we recognised World Book Day with a plethora of book-related activities. We opened with our World Book Day assembly, in which the children strutted their stuff on our 'Book Character Catwalk' and Best Dressed Book Characters were selected by our esteemed judging panel. There were some fantastic costumes this year! We also discussed the importance of reading and the difference that it can make to children's lives.

In addition to book-themed English and maths lessons, the children also took part in a 'community read', in which they read with older/ younger children from other classes. The 'teacher read' was also a highlight of the day, when teachers moved to other classes across the school to read them their favourite stories. Lots of the children took part in the grand 'World Book Day Live Lesson' with millions of children from across the country, whilst younger children excelled in completing the official World Book Day Quiz.

In addition to all of this, we had lots of imaginative entries to our 'Extreme Reading' competition – well done to everyone who entered! A big thanks also to all of the parents who bought school books from our Amazon Wishlist – this is extremely kind and we are ever so grateful. Our school library now has lots more of the latest titles, which will benefit children at Debden for years to come.

Finally, a big thank you to Mrs Caparelli, who has been instrumental in arranging World Book Day – it was probably our best one yet!

Music Concert: On Wednesday, Ms Weetch put together a wonderful music concert, which showcased the musical talents of lots of the children from across the school. What wonderfully talented children we have! There were performances from flute players, drum superstars, piano performers and group percussion pieces, which all of the other children in the school really enjoyed. Sporting Successes: Teams from our school have attended Uttlesford Finals in two events over the past couple of weeks.

Firstly, children from across KS2 had qualified for the cross-country finals, which were held at Carver Barracks. The competition was fierce, with lots of runners, many of whom run regularly as a part of local

clubs outside of school. Despite this, our children performed exceptionally well. I was really pleased to see the children persevering even when they were tired. Standout performances were Karter, who placed 3rd in the year 6 boys race, Romily, who placed 9th in the year 6 girls race, and Maggie, who placed 10th in the year 3 girls race. They placed third within their group, which is an excellent effort for a school of our size.
