## **Newts Newsletter Spring Term**



Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to Newts Class and Happy New Year! I hope you have all had a lovely and restful break after such a busy Autumn Term. Thank you for the kind gifts and Christmas wishes at the end of last term. I'm looking forward to welcoming back the children and am excited to introduce our new topics to the class.

This term our topic will be *The Aztecs* and we will be looking at the reign of the Aztecs and life in the Aztec Empire. The children will develop a chronological understanding of this period and study daily life and customs during this time by completing a historical enquiry. Our topic will also focus on The Americas. We will link this to a study of South and North American portrait artists in Art and Design and compare the different physical and human geography of various countries in the Americas. Our class books this term will be 'Time Travelling Cat and the Aztec Sacrifice' by Julia Jarman and 'Aztec Empire' by Louise Spilsbury.

We are also looking forward to putting together a Spring performance of 'The Bee Musical' which will feature Newts and Frogs classes. More details to follow!

**PE** lessons will continue to be on **Monday** and **Tuesday** (please come into school wearing PE kit on those days). Please note that Year 4 children will be participating in swimming lessons on a Tuesday as their PE lesson until February half term.

Homework grids will also be sent home, which include a variety of tasks based on learning covered this half term. Children can either choose one task every couple of weeks or spend longer completing a bigger task. Homework is not compulsory but there will be rewards for those children who do engage in them. The children will be given a homework book to complete the tasks, in which they bring in and share with the class. We will share, celebrate and give feedback to children at the end of each half term.

Children will be given a homework planner to record their home reading and weekly homework tasks. The expectations are as follows:

- -Read for at least 15 minutes daily
- -Login to Times Tables Rockstars for at least 5 minutes twice a week
- -Complete 2 x activities in their spelling booklets

Please record all homework in their homework diaries- write down the reading that they have done on the right-hand side of the page and record which days they completed TT Rockstars on the left-hand side, along with your signature. We will check the diaries every Friday and if children have completed the above, they will get extra break time.

Children may bring in a pencil case which could include a pencil, rubber, sharpener, glue stick, ruler and colouring pencils.
