Class Allocation 2025-26

Following this newsletter email (at some point today) parents of KS2 children will receive your child's class allocation for 2025-26. (for Key Stage 1 children - Reception to Year 2 - your child's class will simply be the class that corresponds with their age).

For children in Key Stage 2, we have mixed age classes, and so our guiding principle in assigning children to a class is always <u>what we feel is best for the child</u>. We use three main factors in our decision (in this order):

1. The child's current attainment level

2.The child's age

3. Relationships with other children

Science Week

Sports Days

We are really looking forward to the Sports Day next week, with our young athletes primed and ready to go. A reminder that the timings for the Sports Days are:

-Key Stage 1: 9.00am-10.30am

-Key Stage 2: 10.45am-12.30pm

Children will be taking part in a carousel of different sporting events, aiming to win points for their houses. We have already sent out some preliminary information about the days, however please do take note of the additional information below:

-The FODs will be serving refreshments in the wooden gazebo throughout the morning.

-The forecast looks as though it will be a bit cooler next week. We have also put the events in the morning and shortened the timings to reduce time in the sun. Additionally, all children should bring their water bottles and wear suncream. In case it is still very hot/sunny, we have enough gazebos to provide some shade for the school children. However, we do not have enough to shade the parents/ spectators too. If you feel you will require this shade, please feel free to bring along your own parasols etc. Thank you.

-Please note that for Safeguarding reasons, we will need to close the external gates when the Sports Day events begin. Any late parents should go to the school office, where they will be brought through the school to the event by the admin team. Any parents who need to leave during the event will need to contact the nearest staff member to open the gates. Any parents who are attending both the Key Stage 1 and the Key Stage 2 event are welcome to stay in the demarcated parent viewing area in between events, or alternatively may leave the school site and return at the start of the second event.

-Toilets will be provided for parents and toddlers if required – these will be in the Dragonflies classroom (furthest demountable) during the KS1 event and the Kingfishers classroom (nearest demountable) during the KS2 event. School children will be using toilets within the main school building.

Assessments

There have been lots of statutory assessments going on at the moment! Well done to all of the children who have completed their assessments this term – we are very proud of you. We hope to be able to release our results to the parents (including KS1/KS2 SATs, phonics check, multiplication check, and EYFS data) within the next newsletter.
